GERMAN TORNADO CAMOUFLAGE GUIDE

NORM '76

This early scheme was used in 1982 and 1983. Silver grey RAL 7001 on the underside, with a disruptive pattern of RAL 6014, 7012 and black on the side and upper surfaces.

NORM '76 SERIALS

Aviation News¹ reported in 1983 that "from, and including, 43+90" were to be painted in the Norm '83 Scheme and that earlier air force Tornados would be repainted. From that it is reasonable to presume that any Luftwaffe aircraft up to and including 43+89 would, for a time, have been painted in the early scheme. Modeldecal Sheet 87 slightly contracts this in the fact that 43+90 is shown in the initial scheme.

The initial scheme is fairly easy to identify in black and white or colour photographs because of the black area around the cockpit.

The German pre production machines were also painted in this scheme, with the additional of day-glo panels on the wing tips, fin and around the nose between the radome and the front of the cockpit canopy.

98+06 (above) is a pre-production machine (PO7) This, the third German prototype was used for terrain following and autopilot trails². The day-glo orange did not appear on in service machines, but otherwise it is a good

representation of the early camouflage scheme. Model Decal Sheet 87 is a good source of markings for this initial scheme. The Airfix 1/72 Tornado GR1 kit also had marking for a WAKO machine in this scheme³.



NORM '83

Norm 83 has a wrap-around disruptive pattern of Leaf Green, Olivegrun and Schwartzgrun.

The picture below (taken on the 6th of April 1987) is a great illustration of the Norm '83. The Luftwaffe aircraft 44+37, a IDS(T) is from Jagdbombergeschwader 32. It is seen in formation with an F-15C and an RAF GR.1 from 14 Squadron (then based at RAF Brüggen).

Norm '95 uses American Federal Standard colours and is a partial wrap-around of Dark and Light Compass Ghost Grey and Grey Blue.

Light Compass Grey appears on the lower fuselage and undersides. Blue Grey appears on the upper surfaces and the Dark Ghost Compass grey appears on the upper side and underside wing tips.

Wing Root Detail

The inboard area of the wing that is retracted into the fuselage when full wing sweep is employed displays considerable variation in tone and colour due to weathering and wear. FS36173 Dark Grey (Gunze H82, Humbrol 156, Tamiya XF-53) is a good starting point.
